
### Prominent popes

#### Pope #, Name (dates of papacy) Notable events under their papacy

196. Clement V (1305-14) 202. Gregory XI (1370-78) Moved to Avignon (beginning of Babylonian Captivity) in 1309 Moved back to Rome (Schism begins with his death)



213. Sixtus IV (1471-84) -Commissioned Sistine Chapel. Authorized Inquisition targeting converted Jews in Spain at request of Isabella and Ferdinand. 214. Innocent VIII (1484-92) Endorsed the prosecution of witchcraft Spanish Borgia Pope, Granted Isabel & Ferdinand right to 215. Alexander VI (1492-1503) appoint bishops in Spanish lands. Divided the extra-European world between Spain & Portugal in Treaty of Tordesillas (1494) 217. Julius II (1503-13) Warrior Pope (controlled Papal States). Commissioned Michelangelo's Sistine ceiling. Began rebuilding St Peter's. 218. Leo X (1513-21) Medici Pope. Signed Concordat of Bologna with Francis I (1516). Granted indulgences to those who donated to rebuild St. Peter's Basilica. Excommunicated Martin Luther (1521). 220. Clement VII (1523-34) Medici Pope. Rome sacked by HRE troops (1527). Forbade the divorce of Henry VIII. Crowned Charles V as emperor. Opened the Council of Trent (1545). Appointed Michelangelo 221. Paul III (1534-49) to supervise construction of St. Peter's Basilica (1546). Approved the Order of Jesuits. 224. Paul IV (1555-59) Established the Roman (Jewish) Ghetto (1555) and established the Index of Forbidden Books. Ordered Michelangelo to add clothes on The Last Judgment. Established Congregation for the Propagation of the Faith. 235. Gregory XV (1621-23) 236. Urban VIII (1623-44) Trial against Galileo Galilei. Issued a bull that made use of tobacco in holy places punishable by excommunication. 238. Alexander VII (1655-67) Commissioned Bernini's St. Peter's Square. Signed Concordat with Napoleon (1801). Present at 252. Pius VII (1800-23) Coronation of Napoleon as Emperor (1804) 256. Pius IX (1846-78) Opened First Vatican Council; lost the Papal States to Italy. Defined papal infallibility. Issued controversial Syllabus of Errors. 2nd longest serving pope in history after Saint Peter.

20th - 21st Century Popes 260. Pius XI (1922-39)

Signed the Lateran Treaty with Italy (1929) establishing

	Vatican City as a sovereign state.
261. Pius XII (1939-58)	Credited with intervening for peace during World War II; controversial for his role in the Holocaust.
262. John XXIII (1958-63)	Opened the Second Vatican Council; intervened for peace during the Cuban Missile Crisis (1962).
263. Paul VI (1963-78)	Condemned artificial contraception.
265. *John Paul II (1978-2005)	First Polish pope and first non-Italian pope since 16th century.
266. Benedict XVI (2005-13) 267. Francis (2013 to present)	Traveled extensively, visiting 129 countries. 3rd longest reign. Helped end Communist rule in his native Poland and eventually all of Europe. Significantly improved Catholic relations with Judaism, Islam, the Eastern Orthodox Church, and Church of England. First Pope to voluntarily retire since 13th century. Argentinian Pope. First pope to be born outside Europe since 8th century; first from the Americas; first from the Southern Hemisphere. First Jesuit pope. Noted for his concern for the poor, criticisms of consumerism, and attention to environmental issues.



- 1870-1940 Third Republic (Léon Blum, **Popular Front** Prime Minister 1936-37)

- 1944-1946 Provisional government (Pres. Charles de Gaulle)

# Prominent prime Ministers

1721-1742 1834-46	Sir Robert Walpole - 1st Prime Minister <b>Sir Robert Peel</b> - father of modern British police ("Bobbies") and one of founders of the modern Conservative Party; Mines Act 1842; Factories Act 1844; repeal of the Corn Laws
1868-1894	Sir William Gladstone - Promoted Irish self-rule
1916-1922	<b>David Lloyd George</b> - Paris Peace Conference; Votes to all adult males and women over 30 (1918)
1937-1940	<b>Neville Chamberlain</b> - Attempted "peace for our time" through appeasement of Germany; widely criticised following German invasion of Poland (start of WWII)
1940-1955	<b>Winston Churchill</b> - WWII; formed military alliances with the US and USSR; foundation of the United Nations
1979-1990	*Margaret Thatcher - First female Prime Minister (Iron Lady). Falklands War; miners' strike; privatisation of industries; decreased power of the unions;
1997-2007	Tony Blair - Hong Kong handover to China; NATO bombing of Yugoslavia; 2003 invasion of Iraq (and consequent Iraq War)
2010-2016	David Cameron - same-sex marriage legalised; Campaigned for a remain vote in 2016 EU referendum; 52% leave majority prevailed, Cameron resigned.
2016-	Theresa May - Exiting the European Union (Brexit)
